

**YOKOTA TOURS
POLICIES**

You must be 18 or older to sign up for a Yokota Tour. All participants 17 years and under must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian to go on the Yokota Tours. Please read the tour descriptions in this brochure thoroughly. Participants are encouraged to eat a good breakfast prior to departing on all morning tours; you may also bring your own food on the tours. Rest stops are made on all tours lasting over two hours (the food at the rest stops are primarily Japanese and currency used is yen). At all stops, we encourage passengers to return to the same seat taken at the beginning of the tour, and always return to the bus at the time directed by the tour guide. Buses for all Yokota tours depart near building 2000; please arrive at least 15 minutes prior to departure time, as our tours leave promptly, rain or shine.

Full payment for the cost of the tour is due at the time of reservation and must be made in person. All payments must be made in cash, check or charge (VISA, MASTERCARD or CLUB CARD); yen will not be accepted.

Smoking and consumption of alcoholic beverages are prohibited on the tour bus. Personal coolers are acceptable, but must be stored in the luggage compartment beneath the bus. Listening to media players is allowed, but only with the use of headphones. Parents are reminded of their responsibility to ensure their children are well behaved and do not disturb other passengers.

The Yokota ITT staff strives to ensure that you have the most enjoyable trip possible. We will make every reasonable effort to accommodate groups when requested. However, due to seating and ticket availability, this may not always be possible.

The Yokota ITT Office is not responsible for the loss of personal items (baggage, equipment, etc.) left on the bus. The Yokota ITT Office is not responsible for any accidents due to personal negligence or misconduct on the tour.

YOKOTA TOUR WAIT-LIST POLICY

If the tour is filled, you can put your name on a waiting list. If there are any cancellations, we will try to contact you three times via phone. After receiving the phone call, you will have 24 hours to come to the Yokota ITT Office to sign up. After the 24 hour period is over, we will move on to the next person on the list.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

All tour cancellations due to inclement weather will be determined by 4 p.m. on the day before the scheduled tours. Customers will be notified by 6 p.m. that night. In the event a cancellation is necessary, charge refunds will be made the following day and cash refunds will be available after five business days. Receipts from customers will be needed to pay out refunds.

YOKOTA TOURS REFUND POLICY

• One-day tours

Refund will be provided for cancellations made four or more business days prior to tour date. Any cancellations made after four business days will not be entitled to a refund.

• Overnight tours

The cancellation policy will be notated on the tour book for each tour.

• Military Obligations

In the case of a TDY, TAD, exercise or recall, written documentation (TDY orders or letter from squadron commander/first sergeant) must be presented prior to departure for a full refund.

In the event that Yokota ITT had already purchased the admission ticket, you will have to pay for whatever the admission ticket cost regardless of the reason of the cancellation.

You must have your receipt at the time the refund is requested. No refund after 30 days from the event.

POLICY FOR CONDUCT AND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON FSS TOUR BUSES

These guidelines will be followed for the safety and comfort of all passengers traveling aboard 374 FSS sponsored tours to include: Yokota Tours; Outdoor Recreation trips; New Sanno/Narita shuttles; all Private Organizations that contract transportation through 374 FSS Vehicle Operations. The following provisions will be followed by all customers electing to travel upon a 374 FSS bus: Alcoholic beverages are prohibited in the seating and aisle area of the bus. All coolers, bags or backpacks containing alcoholic beverages must be stored within the bus luggage compartment located below and separated from the seating compartment.

A customer found in the seating area with alcoholic beverages will be directed by the 374 FSS escort to immediately move the beverages to the luggage compartment. A customer refusing to comply with the no alcohol policy while en route will be released at the next convenient train station or equal location. The customer is responsible to provide for his or her transportation back to Fussa/Yokota.

Customers found intoxicated upon returning to a 374 FSS bus for the return travel back to Fussa/Yokota will be refused admittance to the bus. They will be directed to the closest train station or equal location. Again, it is the responsibility of the intoxicated person to find another means of travel.

Those persons not permitted to travel with 374 FSS due to the above circumstances shall forfeit their ability to receive a refund for incurred expenses for bus travel and event fees.

Individuals will be referred to the 374th Mission Support Group Commander for non-compliance with the above requirements. Those incidents will be handled under UCMJ or YCAP as appropriate.

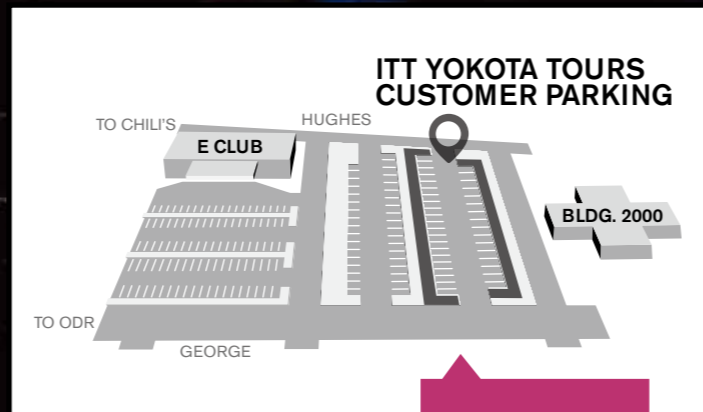

Featured on many documentary specials, this park is famous for its wild monkeys whom you will see face-to-face without cages or enclosures. Families of monkeys migrate through the park every year to forage for food and to take hot baths in natural springs. This park is truly unique for the extreme close-up view it provides of these beautiful, community-oriented animals.

Mount Komuro's Tsubaki Garden is a camellia garden located in Izu Peninsula. It is the one of the biggest camellia gardens in Japan with over 4,000 camellia trees. Take a chair lift to the summit and enjoy a great view. After the garden, we're off to Minna-no Hawaiians, a large Hawaiian-themed Japanese restaurant. Enjoy a buffet with over 60 kinds of Asian and Western dishes including sushi, tempura and much more.

Itokawa area in Atami City is one of the earliest places in the Kanto region to view cherry blossoms every year. The cherry trees of Itokawa is a type of cherry called Atami-zakura or Atami cherry which was crossbred using Okinawan cherry and wild cherry from the mountains of Japan. This kind of sakura is noted for their dark pink blossoms which are very beautiful against the winter sky.

Kinomiya Shrine, with a history of over 1,300 years, has been known as shrine of fortune and good luck. In Shinto religion, it is thought that gods dwell in all things of nature. This shrine has a natural monument, a sacred tree called Okusu, which is said to be more than 2,000 years old. An old tale says that if you go around the trunk once, your life is extended by one year.

Our last destination is Odawara Castle. It was originally built in the mid 15th century and soon fell into the hands of the Hojo Clan, one of the most powerful clans during the Warring State Period who used it as a base to control the region around modern day Tokyo. In 1590 Toyotomi Hideyoshi attacked the castle, and with the defeat of the Hojo Clan, reunifying Japan. However, it was demolished in the latter half of the 19th century and was reconstructed in the 1960's to its original form with a three-tiered, five-storied donjon, with the top floor as an observatory area. The moat and stone wall remain as they were built in the mid 15th century. The museum in the main building has a wide collection of artifacts, armor and weapons. Enjoy the 3D sound winter illumination on the castle ground. It is a fantasy show of lighting and sound entertainment of night cherry blossoms sparkling in the night.

The interactive Cup Noodle Museum is designed to stir the creativity and curiosity within every person and provide a rich educational experience. At the museum you can create your own completely original Cup Noodle package. In a cup that you design, select your favorite soup from among four varieties and four toppings from 12 ingredients. Altogether, there are 5,460 flavor combinations! Unlike other amusement parks, Yokohama Cosmo World has no entrance fee. Instead, customers pay by the individual ride or attraction, allowing for lower overall costs. Prices range from ¥300-¥500 for the kiddie rides and ¥800 for the giant Ferris wheel. Its signature rides, the giant Ferris wheel and the diving roller coaster, "Vanish," are clearly visible from the streets. Our last stop will be the Yokohama Red Brick Warehouse, a major tourist spot in Yokohama, is a cultural and commercial facility that utilizes two historical buildings constructed more than a century ago. It was built as a government bonded warehouse during the Meiji and Taisho eras and, as Japan's first modern port facility, played an important role in the nation's development. Today, the brick buildings house a range of cafes, restaurants and shops.

The city of Nagano is widely known as the host city of the 1998 Winter Olympics. Its origin and development is centered on the grand 1,400 year-old Buddhist temple, Zenkoji. The Temple will be illuminated with numerous lights, inviting visitors into the winter wonderland.

Matsumoto Castle, Japan's oldest wooden castle tower was constructed more than 400 years ago and is one of four castles designated as a national treasure. The donjon of Matsumoto Castle is said to have been built around 1593 or 1594.

This tour includes bus transportation fee, admission to strawberry picking, Kannon statue admission, German village entrance fee and lunch buffet.

Enjoy all-you-can-eat strawberries for a half hour (30 minutes). Futtsu Point Park is a large recreation area in Tokyo Bay. The unique observation deck offers you a fantastic view of the Tokyo Bay, and on clear days you may be able to see Mount Fuji. Tokyo Bay Kannon is a Buddhist Kannon statue that is 184 feet high, built in 1961 for world peace after WWII. In the statue, there are many art works displayed along the 324 steps to reach the observation deck. Enjoy 60 minutes of all-you-can-eat buffet at a hot springs resort "Kimitsu no Mori." The magical illumination of "Tokyo German Village," is voted as one of three greatest winter illumination in the Kanto region. This park is lit with three million LED lights and the theme is different each year. Umihotaru is located midway through the Tokyo Bay Aqua-Line Expressway, which is a bridge/tunnel combination with an overall length of 14 kilometers, it includes a 4.4 kilometers bridge and 9.6 kilometers tunnel underneath the bay; the fourth-longest underwater tunnel in the world. Built on a 650 meter island surrounded by 360 degrees of water, Umihotaru is a highway service area that stands five levels tall, with the only shopping mall on the sea where you can enjoy views of Tokyo Bay, and many shops, restaurants and services.

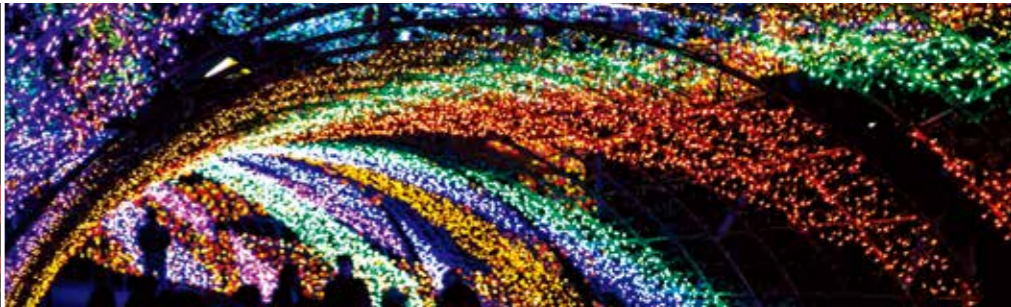

The Mishima Skywalk is the longest pedestrian suspension bridge in Japan where you can enjoy unrestricted panoramic views of the western slopes of Mount Fuji and the Izu Mountains. The bridge is 1,312 feet long and 232 feet high and 5.2 feet wide with the suspension tower 144 feet high. Take a break and shop for souvenirs at the Skygarden filled with flowers with chandelier-like flower decorations covering the ceiling. After the Mishima Skywalk, the tour will head to Izunokuni Panorama Park, which is a leisure facility situated on the 1,483 feet Mount Katsuragi. It contains the "Air Park" which is a seven minute ride to the summit on a ropeway, a 5,900 feet trip overlooking Izunokuni. From the summit observatory, with weather permitting, you can see a 360-degree panorama of Suruga Bay and Mount Fuji. Enjoy a buffet style lunch featuring 50 Asian and Western dishes including salad, pasta, meat dishes, seafood section, fresh vegetable dishes and much more. Our next destination is Odawara Castle which was originally built in the mid 15th century soon fell into the hands of the Hojo Clan, one of the most powerful clans during the Warring State Period who used it as a base to control the region around modern day Tokyo. The museum in the main building at the castle has a nice collection of artifacts, armor and weapons.

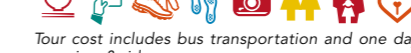

With over 500 different varieties of fish and more than 100,000 sea creatures in all, it is considered to be one of the largest aquariums in Japan. Among the animals are polar bears, penguins, Canadian otters, rare white Russian dolphins, and thousands of fish. The aquarium's special feature is a 20 meter long escalator which carries visitors in a see-through tunnel to view enormous fish tanks. Take a ride on Japan's first surf roller coaster that swings out over the ocean, looping out over the sea for part of its course.

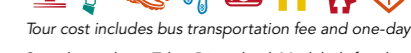

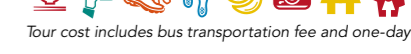
