

You must be 18 or older to sign up for a Yokota Tour. All participants 17 years and under must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian to go on the Yokota Tours. Please read the tour descriptions in this brochure thoroughly. Participants are encouraged to eat a good breakfast prior to departing on all morning tours; you may also bring your own food on the tours. Rest stops are made on all tours lasting over two hours (the food at the rest stops are primarily Japanese and currency used is yen). At all stops, we encourage passengers to return to the same seat taken at the beginning of the tour, and always return to the bus at the time directed by the tour guide. Buses for all Yokota tours depart near building 2000; please arrive at least 15 minutes prior to departure time, as our tours leave promptly, rain or shine.

Full payment for the cost of the tour is due at the time of reservation and must be made in person. All payments must be made in cash, check or charge (VISA, MASTERCARD or CLUB CARD); yen will not be accepted.

Smoking and consumption of alcoholic beverages are prohibited on the tour bus. Personal coolers are acceptable, but must be stored in the luggage compartment beneath the bus. Listening to media players is allowed, but only with the use of headphones. Parents are reminded of their responsibility to ensure their children are well behaved and do not disturb other passengers.

The Yokota ITT staff strives to ensure that you have the most enjoyable trip possible. We will make every reasonable effort to accommodate groups when requested. However, due to seating and ticket availability, this may not always be possible.

The Yokota ITT Office is not responsible for the loss of personal items (baggage, equipment, etc.) left on the bus. The Yokota ITT Office is not responsible for any accidents due to personal negligence or misconduct on the tour.

YOKOTA TOUR WAIT-LIST POLICY

If the tour is filled, you can put your name on a waiting list. If there are any cancellations, we will try to contact you three times via phone. After receiving the phone call, you will have 24 hours to come to the Yokota ITT Office to sign up. After the 24 hour period is over, we will move on to the next person on the list.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

All tour cancellations due to inclement weather will be determined by 4 p.m. on the day before the scheduled tours. Customers will be notified by 6 p.m. that night. In the event a cancellation is necessary, charge refunds will be made the following day and cash refunds will be available after five business days. Receipts from customers will be needed to pay out refunds.

YOKOTA TOURS REFUND POLICY

• One-day tours

Refund will be provided for cancellations made four or more business days prior to tour date. Any cancellations made after four business days will not be entitled to a refund.

• Overnight tours

The cancellation policy will be notated on the tour book for each tour.

• Military Obligations

In the case of a TDY, TAD, exercise or recall, written documentation (TDY orders or letter from squadron commander/first sergeant) must be presented prior to departure for a full refund.

In the event that Yokota ITT had already purchased the admission ticket, you will have to pay for whatever the admission ticket cost regardless of the reason of the cancellation.

You must have your receipt at the time the refund is requested. No refund after 30 days from the event.

POLICY FOR CONDUCT AND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON FSS TOUR BUSES

These guidelines will be followed for the safety and comfort of all passengers traveling aboard 374 FSS sponsored tours to include: Yokota Tours; Outdoor Recreation trips; New Sanno/Narita shuttles; all Private Organizations that contract transportation through 374 FSS Vehicle Operations. The following provisions will be followed by all customers electing to travel upon a 374 FSS bus: Alcoholic beverages are prohibited in the seating and aisle area of the bus. All coolers, bags or backpacks containing alcoholic beverages must be stored within the bus luggage compartment located below and separated from the seating compartment.

A customer found in the seating area with alcoholic beverages will be directed by the 374 FSS escort to immediately move the beverages to the luggage compartment. A customer refusing to comply with the no alcohol policy while en route will be released at the next convenient train station or equal location. The customer is responsible to provide for his or her transportation back to Fussa/Yokota.

Customers found intoxicated upon returning to a 374 FSS bus for the return travel back to Fussa/Yokota will be refused admittance to the bus. They will be directed to the closest train station or equal location. Again, it is the responsibility of the intoxicated person to find another means of travel.

Those persons not permitted to travel with 374 FSS due to the above circumstances shall forfeit their ability to receive a refund for incurred expenses for bus travel and event fees.

Individuals will be referred to the 374th Mission Support Group Commander for non-compliance with the above requirements. Those incidents will be handled under UCMJ or YCAP as appropriate.

UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE TOMIOKA SILK MILL & USUI RAILWAY HERITAGE PARK

Usui Toge Railway Heritage Park is a railway theme park conveying the history of the Usui Railway Line for the enjoyment of all, from small children to adult railway fans. There are about 30 diesel engine trains available for viewing. Before we leave the park, we will take a 2.6 km ride on the tramline that used to run between Yokokawa and Karuizawa.

NEW!

The third Bridge of the Usui Pass is an old red-brick bridge completed in 1892. The bridge, 299 ft long and 102 ft at the highest point, is named "Magane Bashi" or "reading glasses" bridge and is preserved as an important cultural property. It was part of the railway line between the Gunma, Nagano and Niigata prefectures. This railway line was closed down after construction of the bullet train lines in 1963. This trip is not complete without a pleasant walk to the former Kumanotaira Station some 1.2 km away. It'll be about a 30-minute walk through lush forest and old brick tunnels where trains passed many years ago. Tomioka Silk Mill, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is Japan's first modern silk factory for processing silkworm cocoons into raw silk. Established in 1872, the mill was built by the Japanese government with the help of the French to improve the quality of silk produced in Japan. It was part of an effort by the government of the Meiji Period to modernize Japan. The Tomioka Silk Mill received World Heritage status in 2014 because of its crucial role in making Japanese silk an international trade commodity and making textile production the country's most important industry.

over 50 dining facilities and 60 different retail shops in the park. Meet the Disney characters and enjoy the special festivities throughout the park. Tokyo DisneySea is located next to Tokyo Disneyland. The amusement park consists of seven unique themed "ports of call", presenting stories of the ocean for the guests. Attractions at Tokyo DisneySea are created from popular legends of the sea and the sense of exploration and discovery the ocean provides. There are fun rides, entertainment shows, restaurants and shops in this park. Also, the illuminated park is romantic in the evening.

Enjoy breathtaking views from Japan's longest suspension bridge! The Mishima Skywalk is the longest pedestrian suspension bridge in Japan where you can enjoy unrestricted panoramic views of the western slopes of Mount Fuji as well as the Izu Mountains. The bridge is 1,312 ft long, 232 ft high and 5.2 ft wide with the suspension tower being 144 ft high. After the Mishima Skywalk, the tour will head to Izunokuni Panorama Park, which is a leisure facility situated on the 1,483 ft Mt. Katsuragi. It contains the "Air Park" which is a seven-minute ride to the summit on a ropeway, a 5,900 ft trip overlooking Izunokuni. Weather permitting, you can see a 360-degree panorama that includes Suruga Bay and Mount Fuji. Enjoy a buffet-style lunch featuring over 50 Asian and Western dishes including salads, pastas, meats, seafoods and fresh vegetables. Our next destination is Odawara Castle. It was originally built in the mid 15th century and soon fell into the hands of the Hojo Clan, one of the most powerful clans during the Warring States Era. In 1590, Toyotomi Hideyoshi attacked the castle and with the defeat of the Hojo Clan reunited Japan.

Hakone National Park is part of Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park, less than 100 kilometers from Tokyo. Famous for its volcanic landscape and hot springs, Hakone National Park is one of the most popular destinations among Japanese and international tourists. From the aerial car, one will have a sweeping view of the National Park and the valley "Owakudani" (Hell Valley) where you will see smoking volcanic activity. Enjoy the natural scenery while sampling a volcano-cooked black egg before going on a delightful boat ride across Lake Ashi. Hakone Checkpoint used to be an important checkpoint to control traffic along the Tokaido highway which linked Tokyo with Kyoto during the feudal Edo Period. This checkpoint controlled weapons from being brought into Tokyo and kept women and children from fleeing Tokyo. It was in operation for more than 260 years, until 1868, when the Edo period changed to the Meiji period. Hakone Shrine stands at the foot of Mount Hakone along the shores of Lake Ashi. Founded in 757, this shrine is known for its large red torii gate that stands in the lake.

At dusk, all 12 festival floats stand ready to move forward and then they parade along the streets while performing ohayashi music at various locations.

Trip Two: The 22nd or the 3rd day of the festival is considered the climax. Around 9 p.m., the ohayashi performance reaches its peak as if the performers are reluctant to admit the festival is soon to be over. All 12 festival floats gather around Festival Square, where the last performance is given.

Oshino Village is a famous small village in the Fuji Five Lakes region, located between Lake Kawaguchi and Lake Yamanaka, on the site of a former sixth lake that dried out several hundred years ago. It has eight ponds which are fed by snow melt from the slopes of nearby Mount Fuji. The snow melt filters down the mountain taking over 80 years to travel through the porous layers of lava, resulting in very clear spring water that is revered by the locals.

Fuji-Yoshida Sengen Shrine stands in a dense forest and is set off from the road by a long approach lined by stone lanterns and shaded by tall cedar trees. Some say the tall cedar trees are to be as old as 1,000 years. The shrine's buildings include the main hall dating back to 1615. This shrine used to be the common starting point for climbing Mount Fuji from the north side. The trailhead is still located directly behind the right side of the shrine's main hall and some dedicated climbers still begin their ascent with a prayer at the shrine before passing through the wooden torii gate. You will enjoy a buffet style lunch at Sylvans Restaurant. Enjoy your tasty buffet including freshly

baked pizzas, meat dishes, pastas, salads, desserts and more. Mount Fuji's past eruptions and resulting lava flows have created multiple caves in the Fuji Five Lake region around the mountain's base. The Wind Cave, with an average temperature of 3°C, was used as a refrigerator to store silkworm eggs. The Bat Cave, named after its former winter inhabitants, is the most extensive of the three caves. The cave is nearly 350 meters long and has multiple large chambers and diverging tunnels to explore. These caves have been designated as a Japanese national monument.

Your first stop will be at the Manns Winery where there will be free wine tastings. Then you will go to the burial place of Takeda Shingen, a great warrior "Daimyo" (samurai leader of the war age), who died on his journey to Kyoto, in 1572, where he was destined to be a shogun, a military commander. The Samurai temple is noted for the exquisite garden created by Muso Kokushi, a high priest of the Samurai Age. Proceeding on to Chichibu National Park, you will ride the cable car up Mount Kimpu, the highest peak in the Chichibu National Park, to the Shosenkyo Gorge, which was formed along the Arakawa River. Bring your camera so you can take pictures of the rock cliffs and their fantastic shapes.
